




Once you log in to your WordPress site, you access the dashboard by entering your admin credentials. The **WP Admin** login page allows you to access the dashboard by entering your username and password.

- **Log Out:** This option allows you to log out of the admin panel when you're done managing your site.



Side Menu: Full Access to Website Management


The side menu provides quick access to all the essential management tools for your WordPress site:

Quick Dashboard Tips and Settings


