

How To Install And Activate Plugins In WordPress: A Complete Guide


Introduction

Step 2: Installing A New Plugin


Now, let's move to the important part – installing a new plugin. To install a new plugin on your website, follow these steps:

3. When you find the plugin you want to install, click on the **Install Now** button next to it. The installation process will begin, and it will only take a few seconds.

Step 3: Activating The Plugin

Once the plugin has been successfully installed, the next step is to activate it. Without activation, the plugin won't work, even if it's installed.

1. After installation, the **Activate** button will appear where the **Install Now** button was.
2. Simply click on the **Activate** button to enable the plugin on your site.


It's important to note that some plugins might not function properly until activated, so make sure to activate the plugin right after installing it.

Step 4: Why Activating Plugins Is Necessary

You may wonder why activation is necessary after installing a plugin. Here's the reason: when you install a plugin, it is added to your WordPress website but doesn't become fully functional until you activate it. Activation essentially turns the plugin on and allows it to perform its task.

For example, if you install **WPForms** (a contact form plugin), it won't appear on your website or work until you activate it. After activation, you will be able to configure the plugin's settings, add forms, and display them on your pages.

Step 5: Managing Installed Plugins

Now that you have installed and activated your plugin, you can manage it. To view the plugins installed on your site, follow these steps:

1. Go back to the **Plugins** menu and click on **Installed Plugins**.
2. Here, you will see a list of all the plugins installed on your website, including both active and inactive plugins.

From this page, you can:

- **Activate** or **Deactivate** plugins.
- **Delete** plugins you no longer need.
- **Update** plugins when a new version is available.
- Access **Settings** to configure plugin options.

For example, you can deactivate a plugin temporarily if you're troubleshooting an issue or need to disable it for any reason.


Step 6: Adding Plugins From Other Sources (Uploading A Plugin)

In addition to the plugins available in the WordPress repository, you may want to install a plugin from an external source, such as a premium plugin or a plugin downloaded from a different website.

To upload a plugin manually:

1. Go to **Add New Plugin** under the **Plugins** menu.
2. Click on the **Upload Plugin** button at the top of the page.
3. Click on **Choose File**, and then select the plugin zip file from your computer.
4. After selecting the file, click on **Install Now**.
5. Once the plugin is installed, click on **Activate** to enable the plugin.

Step 7: Additional Plugin Recommendations For Your Website



Now that you know how to install and activate plugins, let's look at a few recommended plugins that can enhance your website.


1. **Google Site Kit** – This plugin is great for integrating Google services like Google Analytics and Google Search Console. It provides valuable insights about your website's

2. **Ivory Search** – If you want to improve your website's search functionality, Ivory Search is a great plugin to add. It allows you to create custom search forms and enhance the search experience for your users.
3. **Yoast SEO** – This plugin is one of the most popular SEO plugins, helping you optimize your website for search engines and improve your website's visibility.

You can install these plugins by following the same steps mentioned above.

Step 8: Troubleshooting Plugin Installation

1. **Refresh the Page** – If a newly installed plugin doesn't show up, try refreshing your page. This can sometimes resolve the issue.
